10	•	Opening paragraph is a powerful beginning – READ this!!! No repentance or forgiveness without complete honesty – WHY?
		Kneel humbly before God and ask in the sincerity of my heart what needs changing
		Letter he wrote to member of the church regarding pornography and hiding it

19	•	The two full pages (first section really) is worth reading almost in its entirety
	•	The two run puges (thist section rouny) is worth reading annost in its entirety
20	•	Old Testament law required a generous restitution as part of repentance

•	This law was not eliminated with the Savior's fulfilling the old law
•	Wanting to generously make restitution reveals our desire to repent
•	Restitution to all negatively affected may not be possible
•	When the injured is unwilling to forgive concern should be to generously restore and be patient allowing them time to heal and grant forgiveness
•	Restitution has its boundaries and limits, that shouldn't limit one from seeking generous restitution
•	Recognize that our sins of offense and hurt against others is also directly against Christ – Parable of the sheep and goats
•	Story of girl being hurt by her father and him not seeking to reconcile upon her email
•	Special love and mercy for those who have been abused or victims
